AWHONN Membership Survey Report

AUGUST 2021



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INTRODUCTION

The Association of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses (AWHONN) conducted a member survey from July 23, 2021, to August 22, 2021. Data from the survey allows AWHONN to construct profiles of its member types, shedding light on the composition and characteristics of its membership. The results are critical for the collection of professional and personal demographics, tracking feelings about AWHONN membership value, experience, and engagement, gauging members' perception of AWHONN's commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion, and for added membership marketing efforts. The survey was conducted by the Membership and Volunteer Engagement and Analytics, Operations, Policy, and Strategic Initiatives Departments.

The 2021 membership survey was sent out via email to the full 22,741 AWHONN members. A total of 953 complete responses were received, for an overall response rate of 4%. The response rate is slightly lower than in the past when a 5%-6% response rate had been recorded. Respondents were encouraged to complete the survey by being offered the chance to win a gift card for completing the survey. This incentive was offered each week during the time the survey was open. The completion time for the survey was approximately 15 minutes. When applicable, the graphs and tables throughout this report indicate the total number of individual respondents (as an n-value).

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

AWHONN members reported approximately 99% are registered nurses (Exhibit 1).





Exhibit 1. Are you a registered nurse? (Percent of Respondents, n = 963)

21% report they closely align with women's health nursing, while 87% identified as closely aligned with obstetric nursing, and 23% identified alignment with neonatal nursing (Exhibit 2). Members were given the opportunity to select more than one answer if they felt that they aligned with more than one specialty.

Exhibit 2. In which AWHONN specialty area(s) do you most closely align? (Percent of Respondents, n = 958)




5% of respondents noted aligning only in women's health; 61% align only with obstetric nursing; 4% align only with neonatal nursing. Other combinations of the specialties were also reported (2a).

85% of AWHONN members are not advanced practice nurses (APRNs) (Exhibit 3).

25% of members indicated they are between 15-24 years practicing women's health, obstetric, or neonatal nursing and an additional 24% indicated they have been practicing in the specialty for over 35 years (Exhibit 3a).

Work Setting

The typical AWHONN member reported working in a Community Hospital (42%) in 2021 (Exhibit 4).

70% of members report Intrapartum as a primary clinical focus, followed by Mother/Baby (57%), Antepartum (52%), and Postpartum (51%) (Exhibit 5). Members could select more than one area of clinical focus for this question.

80% of AWHONN members report working full-time in 2021 (Exhibit 6). 19% report 1000-1999 newborns were born at their facility in the previous calendar year, 17% report less than 500 newborns,

and 16% report more than 4,000 newborns were born at their facility in the previous calendar year (Exhibit 7).

Level III (34%) NICU facility was reported as the highest facility among AWHONN members, followed by 26% working in a Level II NICU facility (Exhibit 8).



PERSONAL DEMOGRAPHICS

Age

The typical age bracket of AWHONN members is between 55-64 years (32%) in 2021. 44% of AWHONN members identify over 55 years. This percent is approximately the same as the last time a member survey was conducted. Only 10% of members were less than 34 years old in 2021 (Exhibit 9).

Race/Ethnicity

AWHONN has begun collecting information about the racial and ethnic backgrounds of its members. Members are given eight race categories and are allowed to select more than one. All fields were required, and respondents had the option to select 'Prefer not to answer'.

The vast majority of AWHONN members are white. In fact, 83% of members identified themselves as white alone. Approximately 10% identified as either Black or African American alone or Hispanic, Latino/a, Latinx alone. 1% of members are of some other race or two or more races (Exhibit 10). Compared to national averages, according to the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) and the National Forum of State Nursing Workforce Centers (Forum) workforce survey, approximately 19.2% of RN respondents were minorities, which includes 'other' and 'two or more races' (Smiley et al., 2021).

The distribution of AWHONN members by race is significantly different from the overall U.S. population. According to the latest estimates from the Census Bureau, 81% of the U.S. population is of one race, while 2.8% is two or more races. Of those of a single race, 60% is white, 13% is Black or African American, 6% is Asian, 1% is American Indian/Alaska Native, less than 0.2% is Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, and 2% is some 'other' race (Exhibit 10) (U.S. Census Bureau, 2021).

Gender and Sexual Orientation

Less than 1% of AWHONN members identified as male in 2021. Two members identified as non-binary (Exhibit 11).

91% of AWHONN members identified as straight with approximately 4% identifying as gay, lesbian, bisexual, queer, or questioning (Exhibit 12).

AWHONN ENGAGEMENT

85% of AWHONN members report that the national organization demonstrates a strong commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion through its actions, policies, and programs. Just 12% of respondents answered neither agree nor disagree with the statement on DEI initiatives from the national organization (Exhibit 13).

58% of AWHONN members report that the local Section demonstrates a strong commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion through its actions, policies, and programs, with 25% recording a response of neither agree nor disagree with the statement (Exhibit 14).

Past Activities

Members were asked to rate a range of activities they have engaged in the past three years. Multiple responses could be recorded. 56% of members report engaging in virtual/online education and events in the past three years. The online HUB community engagement of the past three years was 43%, and 37% of members have either participated at the AWHONN Convention or taken an in-person course (Exhibit 15).

Membership

86% of AWHONN members report being very or somewhat satisfied with their membership. This represents a 1% increase compared to the last time this question was asked of members in a survey. Additionally, 94% of members report highly likely or somewhat likely to renew their membership, which represents a 3% increase in this response since the last time the question was asked of members (Exhibit 16 & 17).

Approximately 80% of survey respondents report being full members of AWHONN, and 13% report being e-members. Full members represent 58% of all member categories, while e-members represent 36% of all member categories (Exhibit 18).

Survey respondents were asked about their level of volunteer engagement with AWHONN. 48% of AWHONN members report they have never served as an AWHONN volunteer, nor are they interested in serving. Approximately 15% responded affirmatively to serving as a volunteer, and 26% noted they had not previously served but would be interested in applying for a future volunteer role (Exhibit 19).

Product and Resource Satisfaction

AWHONN members were asked to rate their satisfaction and importance of a range of products and services the association offers. 93% of respondents report EBP Resources are very important, and 80% report that in-person courses are very important (Exhibit 20).

SUMMARY

Approximately 15% of respondents are APRNs; AWHONN's reach to nurses who are exclusively women's health or neonatal nurses who work outside of hospitals and academia is limited. 44% of the membership is 55 years and older, but a higher survey response was from younger nurse demographics. Members' perception is AWHONN's National Office has a higher commitment to DEI compared to AWHONN's Sections and Chapters. AWHONN must continue to diversify its membership (race, ethnicity, sexual orientation) and ensure demographic data are completed in the association's database. Members are engaged through online education, AWHONN HUB, in-person events, AWHONN Convention, and Section/Chapter events. There are gaps between items that are very important and items where members are satisfied. Overall, most respondents are satisfied with their AWHONN membership and are likely to renew.

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
